From AY 2023 (who enrolled the GESL course from/after April 2023), the GESL Certificate of completion is awarded with the doctoral degree to the GESL course students when the students fulfill the following conditions 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and the students passed evaluation of the final presentation at “GESL Workshop”.

1. Students must obtain a total of four credits or more as “GESL 1 (Major)” from the specified lecture courses.
2. Students must obtain a total of two credits or more as “GESL 2 (Minor)” from the specified lecture courses.
3. Students must participate in fieldwork/internships and obtain a total of eight credits or more as “International Training Activities”.
4. Students must make at least two presentations in English at international conferences.
5. Students must satisfy an English proficiency requirement.

1. “GESL 1 (Major)”

Students must obtain a total of four credits or more as “GESL 1 (Major)” from the following specified lecture courses. You must report that you have obtained at least four credits as a GESL 1 (Major research) at the research presentation in the “GESL Workshop”.

(1) GESL special courses

- Environmental Information System Architecture (2 credits)
- Environmental Technoscience and Policy (2 credits)
- Global Environmental Policy Management (2 credits)
- Large-Scale Environmental Systems (2 credits)

(2) Courses offered by Graduate School of Media and Governance (for the graduate students of Media and Governance)

All courses offered by the Graduate School of Media and Governance as GESL1 (Major research subject).

3. International training

Students must participate in fieldwork/internships and obtain at least eight credits as a part of their international training activities. After the fieldwork/internships, students must report the research results and activities of your fieldwork/internships at the GESL. The credits will be given by reviewing the presentation. The subjects that can be applied for as International Training subjects are as follows:

- Fieldwork A and B (2 credits each) for Master student
- Internship A and B (2 credits each) for Master student
- Advanced field work A, B, C, D (8 credits, 4 credits, 4 credits, 6 credits respectively) for Master & Doctoral student
- Global Partners Networking (GR)
- Global Issues Practice (GR)

4. Presentation at International Conference

Students must present at least two times in English at international conferences (such as symposiums, conferences, or workshops which are organized by program committee).

5. English

Students must satisfy an English proficiency requirement. Student should have a Computer-Based TOEFL score of at least 213 points (or a Paper-Based TOEFL score of at least 550 points or an Internet-Based TOEFL score of at least 79–80 points), a TOEIC score of at least 730 points, IELTS Band score of at least 6, or a Grade Pre-1 in the EIKEN Test of Practical English Proficiency. However, students graduated from a university in countries with English as its official language, with a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent, are exempted from this requirement.

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
